During his career, he also had multiple wins at Lexington Junior League, The American Royal, and many other major shows throughout the country.


REMEMBER if you don't tell us we can't post it! This is our first try this month, so if we have not included something you recently accomplished, let us know and we will make sure to put it in next month!


